## RULES

- 1. Text: font Times New Roman, size 12, footnotes 10, space 1.5 with margins 2.5 cm.
- 2. Volume of the text: 12-15 pages with bibliography and summaries (about 1800 signs per page).
- 3. First page of the article: Pierwsza strona artykułu: in the left upper corner the name and surname of the author and the name of the institution; below on the axis the title; summaries in the language of the article and in English (max. 500 signs each); key words in the language of the article and in English at the end of the text.
- 4. Spelling of the names, surnames and other expressions used to describe people: one should use the original spelling of names and surnames in the native language of the desscribed people.
- 5. The use of abbreviations, dates, numerals, tables, pictures and figures:
- Generally accepted abbreviations should be used in the texts: etc., i.e., e.g.
- Dates in the text: a) 15<sup>th</sup> May 1990 r; b) periods from-to: e.g.. 1–10 May 1900, 1 May 10 June 1900; c) when a date appears in brackets the month should be given in Roman numerals, e.g. (8 V 1999).
- Dates in footnotes: a) month in Roman numerals, e.g. 5 III 1900 (except for quotations and narrative); b) if a
  day is unknown, the month should be written in words, e.g. In March 1825
- Spelling of the words 'cebtury' and 'year': a) in the 16<sup>th</sup> century, in the year 1928, in the 16<sup>th</sup> c., in 1928
- In the case of expressions like 'in the second half of', 'in the eighties', numerals may be used
- Numerals: a) written in numbers with spaces, e.g. 1234, 11 456, 234 567; b) written with abbreviations: e.g. thous., 2 thous.
- Every table, figure or diagram should have numeration, title and source- number and title should be written above the illustration and the source below it.
  - 6. In the case of websites, one should give the title, title of website, URL address and the date when it was used in parentheses;
- 7. Footnotes should be placed in the bottom of the page, bibliography at the end of the article;
- 8. Bibliography in the footnotes should be given according to the example given below:
- books: T. Kowalski, Zamość i Zamojszczyzna, Kraków 2007, p. 4.
- articles in magazines: T. Kowalski, *Ukraina dzisiaj*, "Przeglad Politologa", 2014 no. 4, p. 7.
- group work: Zamojszczyzna dzisiaj i jutro, ed. J. Nowak, Zamość 2007, p. 22.
- articles from group work: J. Witkowski, *Polskie wybory*, w: *Wybory parlamentarne w Polsce po roku 1989*, ed. S. Kobus, Warszawa 2007, p. 54.
- use abbreviations from the text and conventional Latin abbreviations: ibidem, idem, eadem, iidem, eaedem, op.
- use classical principles of shortening bibliographic descriptions
